

Destruction of the Government of India Principle: Pressure upon Trustees to Pay and Display

How should trustees properly respond to tax claims or requests for tax information? The panel will consider the changing landscape in relation to the cross border enforcement of revenue claims and an analysis of the implications of this for the trustee. In doing so they will address questions such as:

- How has the Government of India principle been eroded over recent years?
- How should conflicts with beneficiaries in relation to provision of tax information and the payment of taxes be approached?
- What happens if the personal interests or reputation of the trustee or its directors are at stake?
- Can it be a breach of trust to leave trust assets in jurisdictions where tax claims can be enforced?
- In what circumstances might an application to the court be justified?
